

From the HOA Board

Harbour Village HOA Board meeting notes:

The HOA Board meeting was an interesting review of what has been happening in Harbour Village this year. The minutes are available on the HOA website. Here are a few highlights...

<u>Financials</u>: Currently \$3400 above budget. We are lagging in monthly assessments by \$5000. If you haven't paid your monthly assessment, please do so as soon as you can.

Operating expenses for Harbour Village have included pool and spa repairs, irrigation repairs, tree removal of 4-5 big pines and 2 olive trees, and a dock replacement. Water and sewer costs have been unusually high since June. We are waiting on the insurance companies to get back to us on the parking structure by Building 1 that collapsed when a tree fell on it during the microburst.

Special Assessment Update:

Roofs & Gutters: almost completed. Report from independent inspector is complete (and is on the HV website for everyone's information). Minor issues were identified that Five Guys is working to fix.

Work to fix the gutters was scheduled for 11/17 and 11/18, but due to rains, the work will be rescheduled.

<u>Painting</u>: 98% completed. A small section of the pool fence is the last item to be completed, once the metal work on the fence is completed.

<u>Paving</u>: completed. We will be posting signs reminding folks that the speed limit is 10 mph at all times.

Fence on Lakeshore Drive: completed.

<u>Gates</u>: completed. The keypad will continue to be enabled along with the new fob and App system. The Board is checking whether the clickers can be restored.

Landings, steps, fountains: completed.

<u>Budget:</u> \$1800 still to be collected. The project has stayed within budget.

Speed limit and speed

bumps When the roadways were repaved the Board opted to not put the speed bumps back in. Everyone is asked to mind the speed limit of 10mph everywhere in Harbour Village.

Harbour Village Beautification Day:

Unfortunately, the regular operating budget, which is funded by everyone's monthly assessment dues, remains insufficient to manage all that needs to be done. Operating costs across the board have significantly inflated over the past few years. The Board is looking into appropriate changes to bring the cost of regular maintenance down within our fixed income projections. In the meantime, there are things residents can do, as a community, to keep Harbour Village looking beautiful.

One idea is to hold a **HV Beautification Day**. Any resident who wants to participate is invited to gather on **Sunday, December 14 from 9am-12pm,** and help spruce up the neighborhood. Some of the activities might include trimming bushes and small trees, performing small touch-ups and general cleaning up, refreshing the numbers identifying parking spaces, and so on. Let's make it a community day — a chance to meet your neighbors, do something that makes a difference, and generate a feeling of pride and good will. Coffee and snacks will be available! Tempe crime is down: Violent crime in Tempe was down by 21% in the first six months of 2025 compared to the same period in 2024. Throughout the Valley, violent crime was down 8%. Tempe has seen a reduction in violent crime each year since 2021, from 1,133 instances to 899 in 2024. The decrease appears to be continuing this year with an even larger drop. While no amount of crime is acceptable, this trend is good news for the people of Tempe and the Tempe Police Department.
